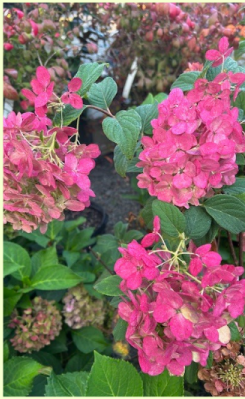
Asters
